



Publication Grants: Further Particulars

The Society makes grants twice every year towards the publication of new works of architectural history. These grants are open to application from all, including non-members. The Society wishes to acknowledge and thank the late Dorothy Stroud and other donors, who have generously supported this initiative.

Conditions

Priority will be given to first-time applicants

No-one can receive more than two grants of the same type

Priority will be given to applicants resident in the United Kingdom or working on the history of the architecture of the United Kingdom, or any part of it

A grant will frequently be only a contribution towards the applicant's costs

A report on the use of the grant should be made to the Secretary within a year of receipt and, if not then completed, annually thereafter

A copy of the book, once published, should be sent to the Secretary

All grants are made and payable in sterling

Grants should be claimed within 3 years of being awarded, and will lapse without notice unless an extension is requested and granted

Amount Awarded

Individual awards do not normally exceed £1,000, but in exceptional circumstances can be up to £2,000. Receipts are required before payment is made. In order to claim a grant, if offered, an applicant should hold an active membership of the SAHGB (although this is not a pre-requisite for the initial application).

Applications

To apply, email the SAHGB's standard application form (available online) to the [Secretary](#) by 1 May and 1 Oct; you should also ask two referees to send letters of support to the Secretary, to arrive by these dates. The information for a complete application is given on the form.
