

Architectural History Book Reviews Policy

- To be considered for review, a book must make a significant scholarly contribution to the discipline considered at an international level. This means it should normally present substantial and previously unpublished primary (typically archival) research.
- 2. Multi-author books and collections of essays will be considered for review only where they contain substantial and previously unpublished primary research on a well-defined topic and make a significant, and potentially lasting, contribution to the discipline.
- 3. We would not normally review books intended as aids for teaching, revised editions or translations, reference books, guidebooks, catalogues or collections of documents.
- 4. Books in languages other than English that meet these conditions may be considered for review, subject to availability of reviewers with suitable expertise.
- Reviews will not normally be undertaken unless a hard copy of the book is supplied. However, books that are published in electronic format only are eligible for consideration, provided they have undergone peer review and meet the criteria above.
